1. 軍事・治安関係

● ハサノフ国防相、ジョージアを訪問

Azerbaijan Defense Minister visits Georgia

On June 01, Minister of Defense Colonel General Zakir Hasanov held a meeting with the Prime Minister of Georgia, Irakli Kobakhidze in Tbilisi, Georgia. The meeting, which was also attended by Vice Prime Minister and Minister of Defense of Georgia, Irakli Chikovani, discussed the current state of bilateral cooperation and issues on the regional and international agenda. The sides also highlighted the importance of maintaining peace and stability in the region and emphasized the high level of strategic partnership and cooperation between Georgia and Azerbaijan in the field of defense.

Colonel General Zakir Hasanov met with Georgia's Vice Prime Minister and Minister of Defense, Irakli Chikovani. The sides held extensive discussions on new prospects for cooperation in the military, military-technical, military educational spheres, and other issues of common interest. Azerbaijani and Iranian border guard delegations hold meeting

On June 1, a meeting was held on the territory of Iran at the Astara state border checkpoint between delegations led by Chief of the State Border Service, Colonel General Elchin Guliyev, and Deputy Commander of the Law Enforcement Forces of Iran, Major General Ghasem Rezaei. The parties discussed the current situation on the Azerbaijan-Iran state border and at border crossing points, measures being implemented to ensure border security, the organization of border protection along the section of the Azerbaijan-Iran state border located in the territories liberated from occupation, as well as efforts aimed at establishing new transport and communication links between the East Zangezur Economic Region Azerbaijan and Nakhchivan. The importance of further strengthening cooperation in combating smuggling, the illegal trafficking of narcotic drugs and psychotropic substances, as well as other manifestations of transnational crime across the state border was emphasized. During bilateral and multilateral meetings attended by the delegation, views were exchanged on strengthening ties in the field of security, prospects for cooperation, and other issues of mutual interest. In accordance with the visit program, the Minister of Defense, together with Georgia’s Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of Defense, Irakli Chikovani and Commander of the Georgian Defense Forces, Lieutenant General Giorgi Matiashvili visited the Mukhrovani base of the Special Operations Command named after Major Gela Chedia. Following a detailed briefing on the military base, the Azerbaijani delegation familiarized itself with the facilities and conditions established there and reviewed a display of weapons and military equipment. UAV attacks on two Azerbaijani-crewed vessels in Azov Sea leave casualties

On the night of June 5, 2026, in the Taganrog Bay of the Azov Sea, UAVs attacked two cargo

ships, the Natra and the Zircon, en route in ballast from Türkiye to Rostov-on-Don to load grain, resulting in the death of five people. "Four UAV hits were recorded on the Natra; two crew members were killed, the fire was extinguished by the crew, the vessel remains afloat and requires towing. Four hits were also recorded on the Zircon ship near the superstructure, three crew members were killed, the crew abandoned the ship in lifeboats, and the vessel is burning," the operational report said.

The Natra ship (flagged by Belize) was carrying 12 people, while the Zircon (flagged by Palau) was carrying 14. All were Azerbaijani citizens privately employed as hired seamen. Both vessels fly foreign flags and have no affiliation with the Azerbaijani state. (TREND / 04.06.2026)

● バクーでパネルセッション「西アゼルバイジャンへの帰還」が開催 **Baku hosts panel session 'Return to Western Azerbaijan'**

On Jun.03, the first international scientific conference titled "Return to Western Azerbaijan: As a New Stage of the National Idea" commenced at Baku State University (BSU). Co-organized by BSU and the Western Azerbaijan Community, the event focuses on the historical, legal, and political aspects of the peaceful and dignified return of Azerbaijanis expelled from present-day Armenia. Shamil Ayrim, a member of the Grand National Assembly of Türkiye, participated in the panel and expressed strong Turkish support for the peaceful approach and repatriation framework of the displaced Azerbaijani population. NOTE: *The rhetoric about "Western Azerbaijan" does not fit into the peace agenda, and we consider the so-called "Western Azerbaijan" as a direct threat to the territorial integrity of Armenia. Armenia's ruling Civil Contract party MP candidate, Foreign Minister Ararat Mirzoyan stated this during a parliamentary election debate on Public Television on Jun.2.*

Azerbaijan approves historic legislative shift to end IDP status through permanent housing allocation

The Azerbaijani parliament is advancing legislative amendments to systematically phase out Internally Displaced Person (IDP) status and transition the state's social support system into a new model. During a joint meeting of parliamentary committees—including Labor and Social Policy, Human Rights, and Legal Policy—lawmakers reviewed comprehensive updates to the Housing Code, the Law on the Status of Refugees and IDPs, and the Law on Social Protection of IDPs. Under the new transitional provisions, any IDP who has been provided with free, newly constructed housing in the liberated territories to replace their former residence will automatically lose their IDP status from the exact date the new law officially enters into force.

Furthermore, a critical new clause expands the grounds for status revocation, stating that citizens will forfeit their IDP status if they refuse the alternative housing or relocation options formally provided by the state in their native regions. Losing IDP status will not result in an immediate cutoff of all social safety nets. The proposed framework maintains that existing social protection mechanisms, such as targeted allowances or subsidies, will remain in effect for exactly three years starting from the specific date the individual officially loses their status or refuses the housing option.

Additionally, newly built residential areas designated for permanent settlement are being moved into a "special-purpose housing fund." Upon relocation, the title of the home will be legally transferred into the citizen's private ownership. However, to prevent speculative real estate markets in newly resettled zones, owners are strictly prohibited from renting or subletting these properties to third parties. (MODERN.AZ / 03.06.2026)

On Jun. 01, the meeting focused on the current state and prospects of Azerbaijan–U.S. relations, as well as issues related to the economy, energy security, transport and communication links, investment and trade, and other topics of mutual interest on the regional agenda. The parties also discussed the situation in the region and progress achieved following the historic agreements reached during the Washington Summit in August of last year, as well as issues related to the opening of communication routes and the implementation of the TRIPP project. ● トランプ米大統領、駐アゼルバイジャン大使候補を指名 U.S. President nominates candidate for post of ambassador to Azerbaijan

U.S. President Donald Trump has nominated Alexander Alden for the post of ambassador to Azerbaijan. Previously, Alden held senior positions at the U.S. State Department, the National Security Council, and the Pentagon. As Acting Assistant Secretary of State for Conflict and Stabilization Operations, he was responsible for implementing the 2020 U.S. Strategy to Prevent Conflict and Promote Stability. As Deputy Assistant Secretary of State for European Affairs, Alden worked to strengthen relations between the U.S. and the European Union. At the National Security Council, he served as Senior Director for Emerging Technologies and Director of Defense Policy, where he established and chaired the Interagency Committee on Critical and Emerging Technologies.

The previous U.S. Ambassador to Azerbaijan, Mark Libby, announced his resignation from this position in December 2024 due to health issues. (TREND / 02.06.2026)

Iran's Supreme Leader Adviser Ali Akbar Velayati has strongly condemned the TRIPP project.

He calls it an American plot designed to weaken Tehran's geopolitical position. Velayati explicitly warned that TRIPP is simply a rebranded version of the extraterritorial Zangezur Corridor. In his meetings with regional diplomats, he stated: This plan has no difference from the 'Zangezur Corridor,' and the Islamic Republic of Iran is definitively opposed to it." He claims the project is built to shift borders and isolate Iran from its neighbors: "This corridor changes the geopolitical situation of the region, shifts borders, and is designed toward the partitioning of Armenia."

Velayati used harsh, hardline rhetoric when addressing U.S. involvement in the South Caucasus. He rejected Donald Trump's mediation by warning that the route would face military resistance: "Is the South Caucasus an ownerless region for Trump to rent it? This passageway will not become a corridor owned by Trump, but rather a graveyard for Trump's mercenaries." He emphasized that Iran views TRIPP as a gateway for Western military encroachment: "We will not allow NATO to place itself like a viper between Iran and Russia." Velayati made it clear that Tehran is prepared to act alone to stop the transit route. He stressed that Iran does not rely on foreign backing to secure its borders: "Islamic Republic, with or without Russia, will prevent the construction of the American corridor in the Caucasus." Following months of military posturing, Velayati recently noted that Iran's firm stance has successfully disrupted Western plans for the South Caucasus: "The shifting calculations in the Caucasus and the fading of the forced term 'Trump Corridor' showed that the map of regional corridors is now being written not by Washington's threats, but by Tehran's realities on the ground." Diplomatic relations were established between Azerbaijan and Micronesia on June 1, the Azerbaijani MFA told. The joint communiqué was signed in New York by the Permanent Representative of Azerbaijan to the UN, Tofiq Musayev, and the Permanent Representative of Micronesia to the UN, Jim Lipwe. Sahiba Gafarova is expected to exchange views with counterparts from other countries, and contribute to discussions on strengthening the role of women in political and public life. During the conference in Belgrade, Sahiba Gafarova addressed participants and presented Azerbaijan's policies aimed at promoting gender equality, women's empowerment, combating discrimination, and expanding opportunities for women in education and employment. Rubio Defends TRIPP as the Economic Anchor for South Caucasus Peace Accord

On June 2, 2026, U.S. Secretary of State Marco Rubio defended the administration's foreign

policy before the Senate Foreign Relations Committee, offering crucial updates on the Trump Route for International Peace and Prosperity (TRIPP). Rubio explicitly defined TRIPP as the primary geopolitical anchor of the broader peace agreement between Armenia and Azerbaijan. He emphasized that the initiative is built to "revolutionize" the South Caucasus by unblocking historical transport links. Rubio noted that the freshly finalized framework is explicitly designed to incentivize and drive U.S. private sector investment directly into the trade corridor. He stated that the project will explicitly benefit "American companies and American interests" alongside regional participants. Rubio assured the committee that while U.S. commercial interests are prioritized, the corridor is structured so that Armenia, Azerbaijan, and neighboring states reap parallel economic gains. He reiterated that the implementation will strictly respect national borders and sovereignty, pushing back against local Russian-backed disinformation campaigns. Rubio framed TRIPP as part of a wider economic foundation that includes joint ventures like the TRIPP Development Company (TDC), a Comprehensive Strategic Partnership Charter, and critical mineral supply chain deals. Territorial Administration and Infrastructure Minister of Armenia Davit Khudatyan participated in the official opening ceremony of the full operation of the Baku-Tbilisi-Kars railway in Akhalkalaki, Georgia. The event was attended by Turkey's Minister of Transport and Infrastructure Abdulkadir Uraloglu, and Azerbaijan's Minister of Digital Development and Transport Rashad Nabiyev. Armenian PM Pashinyan hints on the possibility of a territorial exchange

Armenian PM Pashinyan has floated the possibility of a territorial exchange as part of negotiations over the Armenian exclave of Artsvashen. The prime minister said Armenia and Azerbaijan must decide whether border delimitation is about "hurting one another" or leaving future generations "a country with a proper cadastral document". "Our duty is to leave our children a country that already exists, clearly documented and defined," he said, adding that Armenia's security would continue to rest on strengthening defence capabilities.

Artsvashen (Bashkend) – an Armenian exclave of 40 square kilometres inside Azerbaijan – has been under Baku's control since 1992, following the first Karabakh war. The fate of enclaves on both sides of the border remains one of the most sensitive unresolved issues in ongoing border talks between Yerevan and Baku. (JAM-NEWS.NET / 03.06.2026)

Gafarova noted the positive impact of parliamentary relations on bilateral ties, highlighting the role of friendship groups in strengthening inter-parliamentary cooperation. She expressed satisfaction with collaboration within international parliamentary organizations, particularly mutual support regarding territorial integrity and sovereignty, and discussed opportunities for cooperation between parliamentary committees. Baku hosted Azerbaijan-EU talks on June 2–3 regarding a new draft comprehensive agreement and a document outlining partnership priorities for the period from 2026 through 2030. The Azerbaijani delegation was led by Deputy Foreign Minister Yalchin Rafiyev, while the EU side was led by Audrone Perkauskiene, Deputy Executive Director of the European External Action Service. The constructive discussions resulted in a preliminary agreement on the draft document outlining the partnership priorities between the EU and Azerbaijan for 2026–2030. As part of the negotiations on a new comprehensive agreement, representatives of the relevant Azerbaijani state bodies held productive discussions with their EU counterparts on various sections of the draft agreement, made progress in a number of areas, and outlined plans for the next stages of negotiations. The conference brought together representatives of Sikh communities from all around the world. Discussions focused on keeping the issue of transnational repression and systematic persecution of ethnic and religious minorities-particularly Sikhs and Dalits-by the Indian government. Araghchi provided detailed information on the negotiation process and the latest situation surrounding Iran. Bayramov emphasized the importance of diplomatic efforts in terms of maintaining regional stability. The parties also discussed other issues on the bilateral and regional agenda and recent processes. Putin affirms strong economic and strategic ties with Azerbaijan at SPIEF

On Jun.04, Russian President Vladimir Putin characterized relations between Russia and Azerbaijan as exceptionally warm, cordial, and expanding across multiple sectors. Speaking during a high-profile meeting with the heads of leading international news agencies organized by TASS on the sidelines of the 29th St. Petersburg International Economic Forum (SPIEF), Putin responded to inquiries from the Azerbaijan State News Agency (AZERTAC) by offering a comprehensive overview of current bilateral cooperation.

The Russian leader emphasized that the 2022 Declaration on Allied Interaction serves as a firm foundation for the partnership. He praised President Aliyev for investing significant personal efforts into filling this strategic agreement with concrete, actionable substance. According to Putin, this political alignment has translated into deep economic integration, with Russian direct investments in the Azerbaijani economy now surpassing \$10 billion, alongside a massive network of commercial enterprises utilizing Russian capital operating productively in the Azerbaijani market.

Looking forward, Putin revealed that Moscow and Baku are actively negotiating in highly specific areas, primarily focused on the energy sector. While noting that it is premature to disclose granular details publicly, he confirmed that he will soon hold a personal meeting with President Aliyev to discuss these energy-related initiatives in full.

Alongside energy, infrastructure development remains a top-tier mutual priority, explicitly anchored by the rapid advancement of the North-South Transport Corridor. Putin concluded by recognizing robust cooperation in the humanitarian field, pointing out the extensive

number of Azerbaijani citizens working productively within the Russian Federation.

Russian deputy FM Galuzin outlines Russia's strategy for South Caucasus integration and regional diplomacy

Russian Deputy FM Galuzin delivered a series of detailed statements concerning Azerbaijan, the South Caucasus, Armenia, and Georgia on June 4, 2026, during dedicated panel sessions at the St. Petersburg International Economic Forum (SPIEF). Speaking at the "Russia–Azerbaijan" panel, Galuzin reaffirmed Moscow's principled and unchanged stance to consistently develop the entire complex of relations with Baku. He emphasized that both countries share traditional values and mutual responsibility for regional stability. Notably, Galuzin expressed Russia's readiness to facilitate Azerbaijan's integration with the Eurasian Economic Union (EAEU). He outlined that closer ties would grant Azerbaijan access to a common goods market and boost transport, investments, and services, suggesting that Moscow would also like to see Azerbaijan become a shareholder in the Eurasian Development Bank (EDB) to fund large domestic infrastructure projects.

Galuzin reiterated Russia's active support for the normalization of relations between Yerevan and Baku based on the 2020–2022 trilateral agreements. He stated that Moscow remains fully prepared to provide a Russian venue for the signing of a final peace treaty between Armenia and Azerbaijan, while continuing to assist both nations in unblocking transport and economic corridors and resolving outstanding humanitarian issues.

During the session titled "Platform '3+3': Common Challenges and Strategic Partnership," Galuzin highlighted the massive potential of this mechanism—comprising Armenia, Azerbaijan, Georgia, Russia, Turkey, and Iran. He explicitly noted that this platform is designed to resolve South Caucasus issues from within, "without destructive interference from outside. Galuzin revealed that Russia expects the next "3+3" meeting at the Foreign Ministers' level to take place either in Baku or Yerevan, noting that negotiations on this matter are actively continuing between Azerbaijani and Armenian counterparts. Welcoming Georgian experts present at the forum, Galuzin emphasized that Georgia remains an indispensable partner, without whom the "3+3" platform cannot be fully comprehensive. He expressed Moscow's hope that official Tbilisi will eventually join the platform's active work.
