1. エネルギー・環境



●独企業がSOCARから年約20億立方メートルのアゼルバイジャン産ガスの購入契約締結 欧州のエネルギー市場安定化を狙う 在アゼルバイジャン独大使発表

German companies have contracted approximately 2 billion cubic meters of gas per year from SOCAR, German Ambassador to Azerbaijan Ralf Horlemann said during a media briefing in Baku on June 15. "There are no direct gas supplies to Germany, as there is no pipeline connection between Azerbaijan and Germany. However, the gas that 3 German companies have contracted from SOCAR — about 2 billion cubic meters per year — plays an important role in stabilizing the European energy market, as it provides additional supply volumes to the European market," the Ambassador said. Horlemann noted that the German gas companies that have concluded contracts for gas supplies from Azerbaijan are actually carrying out swap deals with other gas importers in Europe. "First and foremost, this concerns Italy, since about 90% of the Azerbaijani gas imported by the European Union goes there. These agreements are long-term and have been concluded for approximately ten years. I expect that the supply volumes will continue after this period, and perhaps even increase. However, over the next ten years, I estimate their volume will be around 2 billion cubic meters per year," the diplomat said. (Trend, 15.06.2026)

On June 16, SOCAR President Rovshan Najaf met with Nekkhlil Mishra, President and Chief Executive Officer of Independent Project Analysis, Inc. (IPA). The parties reviewed opportunities for cooperation in improving project management systems, enhancing the efficiency of investment projects and capital expenditures, and discussed the application of international best practices in project evaluation and implementation. At the initiative of Leyla Aliyeva, Head of IDEA Public Union, a high-level panel discussion titled "Declining Seas, Retreating Shorelines and Sustainability and the Future of Enclosed Water

Bodies: The Case of the Caspian Sea" was held in Bonn, Germany. The event took place as part of the United Nations June Climate Meetings (SB64), held from June 8 to 16. Speaking at the opening of the event, organized jointly by the IDEA Public Union, the United Nations Environment Programme (UNEP), the COP29 Azerbaijan Presidency, and the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC), Leyla Aliyeva drew attention to the declining water level of the Caspian Sea, the reduction in the population of Caspian seals and other species, and related environmental challenges, stressing the need for solutions grounded in knowledge, expertise, and long-term commitment. During the official proceedings, Simon Stiell, Executive Secretary of the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC); Fatma Varank, CEO of COP31 and Deputy Minister of Environment, Urbanization and Climate Change of Türkiye; and Ana Toni, CEO of COP30, underscored the need to maintain international attention on the challenges arising from the declining water level of the Caspian Sea and the ecological sustainability of endorheic water bodies within the global climate agenda. On June 17, Azerbaijan's Deputy Minister of Economy Rovnag Abdullayev met with Eui-hae Cecilia Chung, Deputy Minister of Foreign Affairs for Political Affairs of the Republic of Korea. The sides discussed the current state and future prospects of Azerbaijan–Korea cooperation, as well as the business environment and the activities of Korean companies operating in Azerbaijan. Abdullayev stated that Azerbaijan attaches particular importance to the development of trade and economic ties with Korea. The meeting also highlighted that Azerbaijan's large-scale energy, transport, and logistics projects, as well as its renewable energy export plans, create new opportunities for cooperation and investment for Korean companies. ●SOCAR グリーンによるとアゼルバイジャンは再生可能エネルギーの設備容量を 2032 年までに 8GW に増加させる計画 エネルギーの海外輸出も視野に

Azerbaijan plans to increase the installed capacity of renewable energy sources to 8 GW by 2032 and views the export of "green" electricity as one of the key directions for the development of the energy sector, Elmir Musayev, CEO of SOCAR Green said on June 17. According to Musayev, SOCAR Green's current projects are only the first stage of a large-scale capacity ramp-up in renewable energy. Musayev recalled that the country's leadership has set ambitious goals in the field of renewable energy. "By 2032, Azerbaijan expects to bring the capacity of renewable energy facilities to 8 GW. Already, projects for approximately 2 GW are in the implementation stage. We expect the share of renewable sources in installed capacity to reach 34 percent by 2028 and about 38 percent by 2030. This figure is planned to increase to 43 percent by 2035", he noted. "This demonstrates the scale of the steps being taken by the state to develop renewable energy. These volumes significantly exceed Azerbaijan's domestic electricity needs," he stated. Musayev noted that, in this regard, the country is banking on the export of ecologically clean electricity. "The next stage is the export of 'green' energy. The growth of domestic demand will not be that high, so we must focus on external markets," he said. (Trend, 17.06.2026)

●エネルギー副大臣が第 6 回上海協力機構（SCO）エネルギー閣僚会合に参加 アゼルバイジャンが地域のエネルギー連結性強化（中央アジア・アゼルバイジャン・グリーンエネルギー回廊）に貢献していると強調

Azerbaijan was represented by Deputy Minister of Energy Kamal Abbasov at the 6th Meeting of Energy Ministers of the Shanghai Cooperation Organization (SCO), held in Bishkek, Kyrgyz Republic on June 19 and made speech. During the speech, he noted that Azerbaijan attaches

special importance to developing relations with the SCO as a Dialogue Partner. It was stated that Azerbaijan contributes to strengthening regional energy connectivity as a reliable energy partner and an important transit hub. The strategic importance of the “Central Asia–Azerbaijan Green Energy Corridor” project was emphasized, and support was expressed for the Kyrgyz Republic’s accession to this initiative. It was noted that the project will strengthen energy connectivity between Central Asia, the South Caucasus, Türkiye and China, and create additional opportunities for electricity transmission along the Middle Corridor connecting Europe and Asia. It was also stressed that Azerbaijan is ready to continue contributing to constructive dialogue and the development of mutually beneficial cooperation within the SCO platform. (Apa, 19.06.2026)

●工業・農業建設施設の電力網接続料金の半額相当を政府が助成 2027年から2030年まで

On June 19, President Aliyev signed a decree on subsidizing the fee for connecting industrial and agricultural construction facilities to the electricity grid. According to the decree, the "Rules for Subsidizing the Fee for Connecting Industrial and Agricultural Construction Facilities to the Electricity Grid" have been approved. The decree stipulates that, in accordance with the Rules approved by Part 1 of this decree, a subsidy amounting to 50 percent of the fee determined by the Tariff (Price) Council of the Republic of Azerbaijan for the service of connecting industrial and agricultural construction facilities to the electricity grid will be paid from the state budget. The subsidy envisaged in Clause 2.1 of this decree will apply to industrial and agricultural construction facilities connected to the electricity grid after the decree enters into force. The decree enters into force on January 1, 2027, and remains valid until December 31, 2030. (Apa, 19.06.2026)

●ムーディーズがアゼルバイジャン国際銀行（ABB）長期債を Ba1（安定的）に据え置き 格付け見直しは安定的

International rating agency Moody’s has reviewed ABB’s ratings and affirmed the Bank’s long-term deposit rating at Ba1. The Bank’s rating outlook has been assessed as Stable. The Bank’s Baseline Credit Assessment (BCA) rating was affirmed at ba2, while its Long-term foreign and local currency Counterparty Risk Ratings (CRRs) and Counterparty Risk Assessment (CR Assessment) ratings were affirmed at Baa3. According to the Agency’s experts, these high ratings are based on the strong market position, competitiveness and sustainable profitability of Azerbaijan’s largest state-owned bank. The Bank maintains high capital adequacy and liquidity levels, while a significant portion of its assets is invested in high-quality financial instruments. ABB continues to hold a leading position in the country’s banking sector, and its financial indicators support its rating level. Moody’s also noted ABB’s intention to acquire a controlling stake in Davr Bank, a private bank operating in Uzbekistan. It stated that ABB’s stake in Davr Bank would be equivalent to approximately 12% of ABB’s assets. (Apa, 15.06.2026)

●**TuranBank がベルギーの投資会社 Incofin Management から 500 万米ドル相当の資金調達 女性起業家への融資を強化**

Within the framework of its partnership with Belgium-based Incofin Investment Management, TuranBank OJSC has secured funding from the Global Gender-Smart Fund S.A., SICAV (GGSF) in the amount of the local currency equivalent of USD 5 million for a period of 3 years. The attracted funds will be directed towards financing micro, small, and medium-sized enterprises (MSMEs), particularly those owned or led by women. The facility aims to improve access to finance for women entrepreneurs, support the growth of their businesses, create new employment opportunities, and contribute to inclusive economic development across Azerbaijan, especially in the regions. ●**中銀総裁がスーク（イスラム債）の発行を準備中である旨言及**

Preparations are underway for the issuance of sukuk (Islamic bonds) in Azerbaijan for the first time, Chairman of the Central Bank of Azerbaijan (CBA) Taleh Kazimov said at the 20th Global Islamic Finance Forum of the Islamic Development Bank, organized within the framework of the Islamic Development Bank Annual Meetings held in Baku on June 17. According to him, a legal and institutional framework for sukuk issuance is being established in the country as part of a project implemented jointly with the Bank: “Azerbaijan is implementing a project jointly with the Islamic Development Bank Group to create Islamic finance infrastructure. As a result of this project, it is expected that a solid legal and regulatory framework will be established, the capacity of financial institutions in Islamic finance will be enhanced, a monitoring and evaluation system will be created, and ultimately the groundwork will be laid for Azerbaijan’s first sukuk issuance. Through this, we will further diversify our financial sector.”, he said. (Apa, 17.06.2026)

3. 国内経済

●**「解放地域」調整本部会合がアグダラ（注：「解放地域」）で開催 第二次「偉大なる帰還」国家計画策定につき協議**

On June 17, another meeting of the Coordination Headquarters for addressing issues in a centralized manner in the liberated territories of Azerbaijan was held in Aghdara city under the chairmanship of Samir Nuriyev, Head of the Presidential Administration of the Republic of Azerbaijan and Head of the Headquarters. During the meeting it was noted that the implementation of the First State Program on the Great Return is nearing completion, while intensive work is underway on drafting the Second State Program on the Great Return. It was noted that sustainable resettlement depends on ensuring employment, creating jobs, and expanding economic opportunities. Particular importance was attached to increasing employment in various sectors, including agriculture, developing vocational skills, supporting entrepreneurship, and enhancing overall economic activity. Issues related to environmental sustainability and water resource management were also discussed. In accordance with the agenda, reports were presented on efforts to ensure the efficient use of agricultural land, organize agrarian production, expand employment opportunities, strengthen environmental sustainability, and improve water resource management in the liberated territories. Concluding the meeting, participants reaffirmed the importance of accelerating the integration of the liberated territories into Azerbaijan’s overall socio-economic development process, ensuring the sustainability of the Great Return. 4. 対外経済関係

●テュルク諸国会議（OTS）加盟国競争当局長会合がシュシャで開催

The 3rd Meeting of the Heads of Competition Authorities of the Organization of Turkic States (OTS) was held in Shusha on June 13, organized by the State Agency for Antimonopoly and Consumer Market Control under the President of the Republic of Azerbaijan. Representatives of the competition authorities of OTS member and observer states delivered addresses during the meeting. As part of the meeting, OTS member and observer states shared their experiences in the field of competition policy, as well as exchanged views on initiatives supporting collaboration. The meeting concluded with the signing of a Joint Communiqué marking the outcomes of the Meeting of the Heads of Competition Authorities of the Organization of Turkic States (OTS). The document charts a path for enhanced collaboration, identifying priorities for joint action in the coming years. (Azertag, 13.06.2026)

●アゼルバイジャンとモンゴル、貨物輸送許可枠を 10 倍に拡大へ

The freight transport permit quota between Azerbaijan and Mongolia has been increased tenfold, Azerbaijan Land Transport Agency (AYNA) under the Ministry of Digital Development and Transport said. The first-ever bilateral meeting in international road transport was held in Baku between AYNA and Mongolia's Ministry of Roads and Transport's Department for Coordination of Road Transport Policy on June 16. Representatives of Azerbaijan's State Customs Committee (SCC), the Azerbaijan International Road Carriers Association (ABADA), and national carriers also attended. Discussions focused on the current state of international road freight transport between Azerbaijan and Mongolia, transit potential, expansion of cooperation, and challenges faced by carriers. As a result, important agreements were reached to boost international freight transport. In 2026, an additional exchange of 2,000 permits for bilateral transport, 250 for transit, and 400 for third-country transport will be conducted. For 2027, the initial quota was set at 2,000 permits for bilateral transport, 250 for transit, and 450 for third-country transport. Thus, the number of exchanged permits between the two countries has increased tenfold compared to previous periods. (report.az, 16.06.2026)

●第 51 回イスラム開発銀行年次総会がバクーで開催

The 51st Annual Meetings of the Islamic Development Bank (IsDB) Group commenced in Baku on June 16. Held under the theme "Regional Integration for Sustainable Prosperity," the event brought together high-level government officials, ministers of finance, economy, planning, development, and investment from member countries, as well as heads of international and regional financial institutions, private sector representatives, and media representatives from the IsDB Group's 57 member countries to promote economic cooperation and sustainable development. The forum aims to strengthen public-private partnerships, support entrepreneurs and small and medium-sized enterprises (SMEs), and foster innovation-driven development in member countries through high-level dialogues, B2B and B2G meetings, startup-focused programs, and knowledge-sharing sessions. During the meeting in Baku IsDB approved \$2.8B

development financing package for Uganda, Tajikistan, Nigeria, Côte d'Ivoire, Turkiye, Palestine, Bangladesh, Gambia and Benin. (Azertag, 16.06.2026)

Azerbaijan has completed the final stage of preparations for the Annual Meetings of the Islamic Development Bank (IsDB) Group, which will take place in Baku on June 16–19 under the theme "Regional Integration for Sustainable Prosperity". On June 13, Minister of Economy and Chairman of the IsDB Board of Governors Mikayil Jabbarov visited the Baku Congress Center together with Chairman of the Islamic Development Bank (IsDB) group Mohammed Al-Jasser to review the final preparations ahead of the event. During the visit, they met with members of the organizing committee and assessed the readiness of the venue to welcome delegations from the bank's 57 member countries. The annual meetings are expected to bring together ministers responsible for finance, economy, development and planning, as well as representatives of international financial institutions, partner organizations and the private sector. Discussions will focus on key socio-economic challenges facing member countries, priority areas for cooperation and strategies for sustainable development. (Azer News, 13.06.2026)

A number of agreements were signed between the Islamic Corporation for the Development of the Private Sector (ICD) and Azerbaijan during the Islamic Development Bank Group's Annual Meetings currently underway in Baku. The newly signed documents include a strategic cooperation agreement between the ICD and SOCAR to explore joint opportunities in financing, investment, and consulting within Azerbaijan. Additionally, a 200 million manat agreement was inked between the ICD and the Azerbaijan Business Development Fund, establishing a framework to provide national-currency credit lines to financial institutions for funding qualified private sector enterprises. Furthermore, a \$50 million framework agreement was signed between the ICD and the Turkic Investment Fund, alongside a \$20 million direct financing line between the ICD and Azerconnect Group, and a \$15 million credit line between the ICD and TuranBank. The credit facility extended to TuranBank will be systematically directed toward financing eligible private sector companies across Azerbaijan. A financing Term Sheet worth \$10 million was also officially exchanged between the International Islamic Trade Finance Corporation (ITFC) and Rabitabank. The collective value of the signed and exchanged financial documents is estimated at \$295 million. (Azertag, 17.06.2026)

●アリエフ大統領が第51回イスラム開発銀行年次総会の開会式に参加

Opening ceremony of the 2026 Annual Meetings of the Islamic Development Bank Group was held in Baku on June 18.

President Aliyev attended the event making speech. Azerbaijani President welcomed participants to the Islamic Development Bank (IsDB) Group Annual Meeting and thanked the organization for choosing Azerbaijan as host for the second time, highlighting the strong partnership between Azerbaijan and the IsDB. He emphasized Azerbaijan's stable political, economic, and social development over the past decades, supported by an independent foreign policy and growing international recognition. The speech outlined Azerbaijan's economic achievements, including diversification beyond oil and gas, attraction of over \$350 billion in investments, low foreign debt, strong financial reserves, and improvements in poverty and unemployment rates. Azerbaijan was also presented as a key regional energy supplier and transportation hub connecting Europe and Asia through major energy and transport corridors. The President described the reconstruction of the liberated territories, where major infrastructure, housing, and development projects are underway, supported in part by the IsDB. Looking ahead, Azerbaijan's priorities include expanding transport connectivity, strengthening food security, increasing agricultural productivity, and developing renewable energy. The country aims to generate at least 8 GW of solar and wind

power by 2032 and continue attracting investments to support sustainable economic growth and regional cooperation.

Chairman of the Islamic Development Bank (IsDB) Group Muhammad Sulaiman Al Jasser also addressed the event

The event concluded with the signing of the Framework (Loan) Agreement on the “Reconstruction of the Garabagh Irrigation Canal” project, the Grant Agreement on the “Reconstruction of the Garabagh Irrigation Canal” project, and the MoU between the Ministry of Economy of Azerbaijan and the Islamic Development Bank on the preparation of the Country Partnership Strategy for the Republic of Azerbaijan. On June 16, Azerbaijan’s Minister of Economy Mikayil Jabbarov met with Lord Stockwood, UK Minister of State for Investment at the Department for Business and Trade. The sides reviewed opportunities for cooperation in the fields of trade expansion, energy security, green energy, innovation, digitalization, and other priority areas. They also highlighted key areas of collaboration, including the promotion of mutual investments, development of the non-oil and gas sector, technology transfer, support for small and medium-sized enterprises, strengthening the private sector, and improving access to capital markets. The officials emphasized the importance of expanding ties between business communities and promoting new investment initiatives.

On June 16, Azerbaijan’s Minister of Economy Mikayil Jabbarov met with Sherard Cowper-Coles, Vice President of the Asian Infrastructure Investment Bank (AIIB), on the sidelines of the Annual Meetings of the Islamic Development Bank Group. The discussions focused on strengthening the strategic partnership between Azerbaijan and the AIIB, as well as reviewing the priorities of the bank’s investment program in the country. The sides also discussed opportunities for implementing joint infrastructure projects aimed at further enhancing Azerbaijan’s role as a regional transit hub.

On June 16, Minister of Economy Mikayil Jabbarov met with Algeria’s Minister of Finance Abdelkrim Bouzred on the sidelines of the Annual Meetings of the Islamic Development Bank Group. The meeting focused on the agenda of economic cooperation between Azerbaijan and Algeria, prospects for expanding trade and investment ties, and opportunities for establishing new cooperation platforms. The sides exchanged views on prospects for enhancing cooperation in industry, energy, small and medium-sized enterprises, tourism, transit, logistics, and other sectors.

On June 16, Minister of Economy Mikayil Jabbarov met with Tahir Hamid Ngulin, Minister of State, Minister of Finance, Budget, Economy, Planning and International Cooperation of the Republic of Chad on the sidelines of the Annual Meetings of the Islamic Development Bank Group. They discussed opportunities to further strengthen cooperation in trade, investment, energy, digitalization, and other fields. (Azertag, Trend, Azer News, 16.06.2026)

On June 17, Mikayil Jabbarov, Azerbaijan’s Minister of Economy, met with Abdulhamid Alkhalifa, President of the OPEC Fund for International Development, on the sidelines of the Annual Meetings of the Islamic Development Bank (IsDB) Group. The sides discussed the main areas of cooperation between Azerbaijan and the OPEC Fund, as well as prospects for further developing the partnership. The parties reviewed activities related to the implementation of the Country Partnership Framework for 2025–2030. They also exchanged views on efforts aimed at improving water supply, developing social infrastructure, and enhancing environmental sustainability. In addition, they explored opportunities to support the private sector, promote investment, and participate in regional connectivity projects.

On June 17, Jabbarov met with Abdurahmon Abdurahmonzoda, Minister of Economic Development and Trade of Tajikistan. The meeting focused on the current state of and prospects for economic cooperation between Azerbaijan and Tajikistan. The parties exchanged views on

enhancing cooperation in trade and investment, promoting joint economic initiatives, and strengthening their mutually beneficial partnership. They noted that cooperation in industry, energy, transport and logistics, and other priority areas is of great importance to the development of economic relations between the two countries. The meeting also focused on opportunities for deepening ties between the business communities of the two countries and implementing joint projects.

On June 17, Jabbarov met with Ismael Nabe, Guinea's Minister of Planning, International Cooperation and Development, and Facinet Sylla, Minister of Infrastructure. The meeting focused on the current state and prospects of bilateral economic cooperation between Azerbaijan and Guinea. The parties discussed the expansion of the legal framework governing economic relations and explored opportunities for strengthening business partnerships. During the meeting, a MoU on economic cooperation was signed between the Ministry of Economy of Azerbaijan and the Ministry of Planning, International Cooperation and Development of Guinea. The document is expected to make a contribution to expanding cooperation in the fields of trade, investment, and technology, while also supporting sustainable and inclusive development initiatives. On June 18, Mikayil Jabbarov, Azerbaijan's Minister of Economy, met with Mehdi Heidari, Vice Minister of Economic Affairs and Finance of the Islamic Republic of Iran and Head of the Organization for Investment, Economic and Technical Assistance of Iran (OIETAI), on the sidelines of the Annual Meetings of the Islamic Development Bank (IsDB) Group. The parties exchanged views on enhancing cooperation in the fields of trade, investment, and transport, and explored opportunities for further strengthening business ties.

On June 18, Jabbarov met with Baghdad Amreyev, President of the Turkic Investment Fund, and Ramil Babayev, Director General of the Fund. The meeting discussed the results achieved in the development of economic cooperation and diversification of partnership among Turkic states. The sides exchanged views on strengthening institutional cooperation, developing regional energy connectivity, promoting the private sector, supporting projects serving sustainable development, and expanding cooperation with financial institutions.

On June 18, Jabbarov met with bDr. Ahmed Rostom, Minister of Planning and Economic Development of the Arab Republic of Egypt. They engaged in discussions on establishing business platforms that foster mutual engagement, opportunities to unlock the potential of economic cooperation between the countries, establish business platforms that foster mutual engagement, and promote collaboration in trade, investment, industry, energy, tourism, and other sectors.

On June 18, Jabbarov met with Marius-Gabriel Lazurca, Advisor to the President of Romania on Foreign Policy and National Security. During the meeting, the sides discussed key areas of economic and trade cooperation between Azerbaijan and Romania, as well as the promotion of mutual investments and future partnership prospects. On June 19, Mikayil Jabbarov, Minister of Economy met with Serhat Köksal, President of the Black Sea Trade and Development Bank (BSTDB). According to Al Jasser, the IsDB Group also approved new financing worth \$2.8 billion for nine transformative projects aimed at strengthening connectivity among member countries, enhancing energy security, developing food systems, reinforcing climate resilience, and advancing the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). The IsDB Chairman also expressed his gratitude for being awarded the “Dostlug” (Friendship) Order by President Aliyev. The chairmanship of the Board of Governors of the IsDB was handed over from the Republic of Azerbaijan to Burkina Faso on the final day of the IsDB Group Annual Meetings 2026 on June 19. "Azerbaijan has three active investment funds with Kazakhstan, Uzbekistan, and Kyrgyzstan. Azerbaijan's share in these funds is 50%, 75%, and 100%, respectively. We encourage both public and private sector investments in these countries, while also showing openness to attracting investments from them," he said. Jabbarov added that Azerbaijan serves as a natural hub for Central Asian countries rich in energy and mineral resources, providing access to the West through the Middle Corridor. Recalling ADB's extensive experience in supporting the issuance of green bonds and sustainability bonds, the director said similar mechanisms could be applied to the Middle Corridor: "I look forward to closer cooperation with stakeholders across the region to support the Middle Corridor project.", he said.
