● ドローンがウクライナ内の SOCAR ガソリンスタンドを攻撃

Drones attack SOCAR gas station in Ukraine

SOCAR Energy Ukraine said in a statement that three Shahed-type attack drones hit a SOCAR facility in the village of Nechayane in Ukraine's Mykolaiv district. The attack damaged the building of the fuel station complex. There were no casualties. SOCAR also noted that it has equipped shelters at a number of its fuel stations across Ukraine which remain open around the clock for anyone seeking protection during air raid alerts. Researchers report non-combat casualties in Azerbaijan's security forces

German-based Caspian Defense Studies Institute (CDSI) reports that at least 26 servicemen in Azerbaijan's security and defense sector died in non-combat incidents between January and early July 2026. According to updated monitoring data, the deaths were caused mainly by traffic accidents, illness, suicides, and other accidents, with several cases remaining undisclosed. The fatalities were recorded across multiple state institutions, including the Ministry of Defense and the State Border Service. CDSI notes that such non-combat losses continue to be a recurring issue in Azerbaijan's armed forces, based on open-source monitoring of publicly available information. Zelenskyy thanks Azerbaijan, Türkiye for military cooperation

Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy has once again thanked Azerbaijan and Türkiye for cooperation. Answering a question from a correspondent of Report's Eastern Europe bureau in an online format, the Ukrainian president said: "I would like to thank Azerbaijan. I would also like to thank Türkiye. Azerbaijan to conduct population census in 2029

President Aliyev signed a decree on conducting a population census in the country in 2029. According to the decree, the next population census in Azerbaijan as of October 1, 2029, will be held from October 1 to 31 of that year. The State Statistical Committee of Azerbaijan was entrusted with the preparatory work and its conduct, processing, publication, and dissemination of the results. (TREND / 07.07.2026)

● **アゼルバイジャン系ユダヤ人共同体、イスラエル国会に「アルメニア人虐殺」の承認見送りを要請**

Azerbaijani Jewish community calls on Israeli Parliament not to recognize Armenian Genocide

Three leaders of Azerbaijan's Jewish communities urged members of Israel's parliament not to support official recognition of the Armenian Genocide, arguing that it could harm regional peace and Azerbaijan–Israel relations. They said such historical issues should be left to historians rather than political bodies. Their appeal came after Israel's government approved a bill recognizing the genocide, calling it a moral and historical duty. Azerbaijan and Turkey criticized Israel's decision, saying it could undermine reconciliation.

Note that Israeli media confirmed that Foreign Minister Gideon Sa'ar spoke with his Azerbaijani counterpart before the Israeli cabinet unanimously approved a resolution recognizing the Armenian Genocide. Despite this prior notification, Azerbaijan expressed "serious concern", labeling the recognition a "distortion of historical facts". (OC-MEDIA / 02.07.2026)

President Aliyev sends congratulatory letter to President Donald Trump

President Aliyev congratulated Donald Trump on the 250th anniversary of U.S. independence, praising the country's history, global leadership, and Trump's policies. He highlighted the strengthening of Azerbaijan–US strategic partnership, welcomed expanded cooperation in areas such as energy, security, and artificial intelligence, and thanked Trump for supporting peace efforts in the South Caucasus. Aliyev also praised regional infrastructure initiatives such as TRIPP and expressed confidence that bilateral ties would continue to deepen. (TREND / 04.07.2026)

Armenia's Pashinyan highlights peace process with Azerbaijan and regional connectivity

In recent days, Armenian PM Pashinyan has reiterated his commitment to normalizing relations with Azerbaijan, describing a lasting peace agreement as a strategic priority for Armenia. Speaking at public events and in meetings with international partners, he has said that Armenia remains committed to regional peace, cooperation, and the reopening of transport links, presenting these goals as essential for the country's economic development and regional stability.

Pashinyan also announced that Armenia has begun preparatory work to restore railway infrastructure leading to its borders with Azerbaijan and Türkiye. According to him, the Armenian government will initially finance and carry out reconstruction of sections such as Yeraskh and Gyumri–Akhurik, while discussions on the remaining railway segments, including those connected to Azerbaijan, will continue with relevant partners. He presented the railway restoration as part of Armenia's broader vision of reopening regional communications after decades of closed borders.

The Armenian prime minister has also continued to advocate for adopting a new constitution through a national referendum. While Azerbaijan has repeatedly argued that Armenia's current constitution contains territorial claims that must be removed before a final peace treaty can be signed, Pashinyan has framed constitutional reform as a domestic necessity aimed at strengthening Armenia's democratic legitimacy rather than as a response to Azerbaijani demands. Azerbaijan's Foreign Ministry summons Russian ambassador

On Jul. 06, Azerbaijan's MFA summoned Russian Ambassador Mikhail Yevdokimov to strongly protest a July 5 drone strike that hit a SOCAR gas station in Ukraine's Mykolaiv region. The ministry said the attack followed previous strikes on SOCAR facilities in Ukraine, describing the repeated incidents as deliberate. Azerbaijan also raised concerns over damage to its embassy in Kyiv and honorary consulate in Kharkiv from air strikes, urging Russia to investigate the incidents, provide explanations, and fulfill its international obligations to protect civilian infrastructure and diplomatic missions. FM Bayramov meets new UN Resident Coordinator in Azerbaijan

On Jul.06, FM Bayramov met with newly appointed UN Resident Coordinator Dmitry Shlapachenko to discuss strengthening Azerbaijan-UN cooperation, regional security, and sustainable development. The sides highlighted nearly 35 years of partnership, the new 2026–2030 UN Sustainable Development Cooperation Framework, and Azerbaijan's role in

hosting major international events and expanding regional connectivity. Bayramov also briefed the UN on post-conflict reconstruction, the return of displaced persons, and the Azerbaijan-Armenia normalization process, while Shlapachenko reaffirmed the UN's commitment to deepening cooperation and advancing the Sustainable Development Goals in Azerbaijan. Azerbaijan, Zimbabwe enhance interparliamentary cooperation

On July. 06, Speaker of Milli Majlis Sahiba Gafarova met with Zimbabwean National Assembly Speaker Jacob Mudenda to discuss expanding bilateral and parliamentary cooperation. The sides praised strong political ties, collaboration within the UN and Non-Aligned Movement, and the importance of increasing contacts between their legislatures. Mudenda reaffirmed Zimbabwe's commitment to strengthening relations with Azerbaijan, highlighted the value of multilateral cooperation, and expressed interest in expanding economic ties. Conference in Shusha calls on Russia to recognize Circassian genocide

A conference held in Shusha on July 06 called on Russia to recognize what participants described as the genocide of the Circassian people during the 19th-century Caucasian War. Attendees also urged Moscow to stop coercing members of ethnic minorities, including Circassians, Chechens, Lezgins, Avars, and Kumyks, into participating in the war in Ukraine. The conference, titled "Cultural and Ethnic Diversity: Lessons from History, Modern Challenges," was organized by the Center for Cultural and Ethnic Diversity, an Azerbaijani public association founded by journalist Seyfaddin Guseinli. According to the organizers and speakers, Russia has not adequately addressed historical grievances related to the Circassian people. They cited restrictions on commemorative events, insufficient support for the Circassian language, and the continued glorification of figures associated with the Russian conquest of the Caucasus.

At the conclusion of the conference, participants adopted a declaration urging Russia to officially recognize the Circassian genocide, open historical archives, combat chauvinism and xenophobia, and end pressure on ethnic minorities to participate in military operations.

The conference also referred to Ukraine's 2025 recognition of the Circassian genocide, while noting that the decision was criticized by the International Circassian Association. (KAVKAZ UZEL / 06.07.2026)

YNET: 'Israel crossed a red line': Azerbaijan crisis deepens after Armenia genocide

Israel's decision to recognize the Armenian genocide has reportedly led to a significant diplomatic crisis with Azerbaijan. According to officials familiar with the relationship between the two countries, Azerbaijan views the move as a "red line" and believes Israel failed to appreciate the support Baku has consistently provided, particularly during the Gaza war. Azerbaijani officials were especially disappointed that Israel informed them of the decision only after it had already been announced, rather than consulting them beforehand.

The article explains that Azerbaijan's strong reaction is rooted in its long-standing conflict with Armenia and the lasting impact of the Nagorno-Karabakh conflict, during which many Azerbaijanis were displaced. Azerbaijani officials also argue that organizations advocating for recognition of the Armenian genocide have accused Azerbaijan of ethnic cleansing, making the issue especially sensitive from Baku's perspective. They believe Israel should have taken these concerns into account, especially given Azerbaijan's decision not to publicly criticize Israel during conflicts in Gaza, Lebanon, and Iran.

The report further states that Azerbaijan fears the decision could damage the close relationship the two countries have built over many years, including cooperation in security, tourism, and trade. It notes that previous Israeli governments had reportedly refrained from recognizing the Armenian genocide after consulting Azerbaijani officials.

The officials also added that both Azerbaijan and Armenia believe such recognition only harms the peace agreement between the two countries and serves Russia and Iran. Armenia's prime minister even criticized the Israeli recognition, which was ostensibly intended to support his country. According to the officials cited, Azerbaijan hopes Israel will not take additional steps, such as advancing the issue in the Knesset, in order to prevent further deterioration of bilateral relations. The sides also discussed cooperation within the UN, the Non-Aligned Movement, and the Inter-Parliamentary Union, while FM Bayramov highlighted Azerbaijan’s post-conflict peace efforts, reconstruction initiatives, and support for Zimbabwe’s upcoming UN Security Council term. They also exchanged views on regional issues, future contacts, the expansion of the activities of the intergovernmental commission, and interparliamentary cooperation. On Jul.08, Bayramov and Safadi held an expanded meeting followed by political consultations between the foreign ministries of the two countries. The ministers discussed

the current state of Azerbaijan–Jordan relations. The two sides also signed agreements on the abolition of visa requirements for holders of diplomatic, special and service passports, as well as a memorandum of understanding on cooperation in the energy sector. The agreements are expected to facilitate official exchanges and promote deeper collaboration between the two countries.

At a joint press conference, the ministers highlighted opportunities to increase cooperation in trade, investment, tourism, transport, energy and parliamentary relations. They also stressed the importance of expanding mutual visits and encouraging direct contacts between business communities.

Bayramov also briefed his Jordanian counterpart on the normalization process between Azerbaijan and Armenia, while Safadi expressed Jordan's support for the peace process and welcomed progress toward a peace agreement. The ministers also exchanged views on developments in the Middle East and other regional and international issues of mutual concern. (TREND / 08.07.2026)

The sides also highlighted priority areas for collaboration in forensic examination, probation, the enforcement of court decisions, legal education, and scientific research. They reviewed ongoing cooperation with Council of Europe bodies, including GRECO, MONEYVAL, CCPE, and the T-CY Committee, exchanged views on the implementation of joint initiatives, and reaffirmed their commitment to expanding cooperation and sharing expertise. Veronika Zonabend, the wife of former Nagorno-Karabakh state minister Ruben Vardanyan, has appealed to Armenian Prime Minister Nikol Pashinyan, the International Committee of the Red Cross, the EU, and Azerbaijani Ombudsman Sabina Aliyeva to support a humanitarian visit to Armenian prisoners held in Azerbaijan. She said the initiative aims to allow a women's delegation to meet detainees, deliver letters and personal belongings from their families, and ensure the visit is organized through official channels with appropriate safety guarantees. FM Bayramov highlights progress in peace agenda, transport connectivity and border delimitation

On Jul.09, FM Bayramov reaffirmed Baku's commitment to advancing the normalization process with Armenia, saying progress continues on key elements of the bilateral agenda, including the peace treaty, state border delimitation and regional transport connectivity.

Speaking to journalists on the sidelines of events marking the professional holiday of Azerbaijan's diplomatic service, Bayramov said the process of delimiting the state border with Armenia has produced positive results and continues through the bilateral commissions established by the two countries.

The minister reiterated that Azerbaijan has completed its work on the text of the peace agreement and expects Armenia to take the remaining steps necessary for the treaty's signing. He stressed that sustainable normalization requires the removal of outstanding legal and political obstacles, while emphasizing Azerbaijan's commitment to resolving all remaining issues through dialogue based on mutual respect for sovereignty and territorial integrity.

Commenting on regional transport initiatives, Bayramov said discussions are continuing on the Trump Route for International Peace and Prosperity (TRIPP) project with the participation of Azerbaijan, the United States and Armenia. According to him, preliminary consultations are underway, and Azerbaijan is being kept informed of developments throughout the process. He noted that both the starting and ending points of the proposed route are located on Azerbaijani territory and said the relevant documentation is currently being prepared. Expressing optimism about the initiative, Bayramov said new developments regarding the project are expected in the near future. (TREND / 09.07.2026)

On 8 July, during a press conference in Yerevan, Iran's Ambassador to Armenia, Khalil Shirgholami, made several remarks concerning Azerbaijan.

He addressed allegations that Iranian attacks had been launched from Azerbaijani territory, stating that Iran had heard unofficial reports to that effect but that Iranian military and security authorities had not confirmed them. He added that if it were established that attacks against Iran had been launched from the territory of any country, Iran's response would be clear. Referring to the drone incident involving Nakhchivan, Shirgholami said that after the incident President Aliyev had made a strong statement against Iran, but Tehran had responded with restraint and the matter had subsequently been resolved through diplomatic channels. The ambassador also contrasted the approaches of Armenia and Azerbaijan following the recent events in Iran. He noted that Armenian PM Pashinyan personally attended the funeral ceremonies in Tehran, while Azerbaijani President did not, saying that Iran appreciated the support shown by those leaders who came to Tehran during the mourning period. Shirgholami further emphasized that Iran seeks constructive relations with all of its neighbors, including Azerbaijan, and said that the planned Armenia–Iran strategic partnership agreement is not directed against any third country, but is intended to expand bilateral cooperation in political, economic, transport, investment and security fields.
