●アゼルバイジャンとウズベキスタン、タシケントで国防分野の経験を共有 **Azerbaijan, Uzbekistan exchange defense experience in Tashkent**

A working meeting between the Azerbaijani and Uzbek Ministries of Defense was held in Tashkent to exchange experience in ideological and psychological support within the armed forces. The sides discussed promoting patriotism, national and moral values, and psychological resilience among military personnel, as well as the role of cultural activities in these areas. ●ホジャベンド地区でトラクター運転手が地雷に触れて負傷 **The tractor driver detonated a mine in the Khojavend district**

On Aug. 21, a tractor driver, Ramal Shirinov, was injured after his vehicle hit a mine in the village of Dyudyukchu in Khojavend district. He suffered multiple shrapnel wounds but was reported to be in stable condition and discharged for outpatient treatment. The incident comes amid an increase in mine explosions linked to expanding agricultural, reconstruction and resettlement activities in areas where demining remains incomplete. ADEX 2026 Sets New Participation Record

The 6th Azerbaijan International Defense Exhibition (ADEX 2026) will be held at Baku Expo Center from September 30 to October 2, with more than 200 companies from over 20 countries already confirming participation. For the first time, the exhibition will use Pavilion 5, expanding its exhibition space and setting a new record in its history. The United States, the United Kingdom and Germany will participate for the first time, with major companies including Lockheed Martin, SIG SAUER and Rheinmetall among the newcomers. ●メフリバン・アリエバ第 1 副大統領、誕生日に国内で公務を行い、各国要人から祝賀電話を受ける

First Vice President Mehriban Aliyeva marks birthday with public activities and foreign birthday calls

First Vice-President of Azerbaijan Mehriban Aliyeva marked her birthday on August 26 with a series of public activities and congratulatory calls from senior foreign officials.

Aliyeva, who turned 62 years old, accompanied by her daughters Leyla Aliyeva and Arzu Aliyeva, visited the Scientific Research Institute of Pediatrics in Baku and also took part in the opening of the new Bilgah Art School and the opening of nursery-kindergarten No. 352 in Baku's Nasimi district.

Besides, on the occasion of her birthday, Aliyeva received congratulatory telephone calls from several prominent foreign officials.

- Valentina Matviyenko, Speaker of Russia's Federation Council, referred to their previous meetings and Aliyeva's role in the development of Azerbaijani-Russian relations.

- Ziroat Mirziyoyeva, First Lady of Uzbekistan, also called Aliyeva and conveyed her birthday wishes. The call came shortly after Aliyeva and President Aliyev's visit to Uzbekistan.
- Emine Erdoğan, First Lady of Türkiye, likewise called Aliyeva to offer her congratulations. The two first ladies expressed confidence that the close relations and strategic alliance between Azerbaijan and Türkiye would continue to develop.

In addition to the phone calls, Aliyeva received written birthday congratulations from a number of foreign leaders and officials, including Uzbek President Shavkat Mirziyoyev, Zahra Pezeshkian, the Iranian president's daughter, Belarusian President Alexander Lukashenko and Tatarstan Rais Rustam Minnikhanov. Azerbaijani pro-government media hits back at Russian MFA over criticism of Baku-Kyiv ties

On Aug.21, Russian Foreign Ministry spokesperson Maria Zakharova sharply criticized Ukraine's growing relations with Azerbaijan and Armenia, saying that Russian society considers contacts with the government of President Volodymyr Zelenskyy unacceptable, particularly when they involve countries Moscow regards as partners and allies. Her comments followed Zelenskyy's call to strengthen Ukraine's relations with Azerbaijan and restore ties with Armenia.

Zakharova argued that the issue goes beyond the position of the Russian government, claiming that Russian citizens themselves question why countries that are supposedly Moscow's allies and friends continue to engage with Kyiv. She accused the Ukrainian authorities of pursuing an openly "neo-Nazi" policy, targeting Russia and civilians, including citizens of other CIS countries, and of allegedly glorifying supporters of Nazi Germany. She condemned visits by foreign officials to Kyiv and their participation in what she described as politicized events where Ukraine is allowed to make threats against Russia. Zakharova said Moscow could not simply ignore such behavior or "leave it to their conscience." Instead, she

warned that Russia would draw the attention of these countries to the risks their policies could create for relations with Moscow.

The remarks prompted a strongly worded reaction from Azerbaijani pro-government media MINVAL, which portrayed Zakharova's statement as an attempt by Moscow to dictate Azerbaijan's foreign-policy choices. The reaction argues that Russia has no grounds to lecture Baku about its relations with Kyiv, particularly given Moscow's own decades-long political, military and economic partnership with Armenia during the Nagorno-Karabakh conflict. MINVAL recalls that Russia supplied Armenia with weapons while simultaneously acting as a mediator in the Karabakh peace process and maintaining close relations with both Yerevan and Baku. It also points to Moscow's relations with Armenian separatist figures and Russia's deployment of peacekeepers to Karabakh after the 2020 war. Against this background, the article presents Moscow's criticism of Azerbaijan's contacts with Ukraine as a double standard: Russian military and political cooperation with Armenia was described as strategic partnership, while Azerbaijan's engagement with Ukraine is portrayed by Moscow as unacceptable.

The reaction also rejects Zakharova's characterization of Ukraine as a "neo-Nazi" state and criticizes Moscow for using such rhetoric to justify its policy toward Kyiv. It argues that Russia, having launched the full-scale war against Ukraine, is in no position to lecture other countries about their relations with Kyiv or to demand that they account for the risks of such cooperation. Another major element of the Azerbaijani response is the deterioration in Russian-Azerbaijani relations following the December 2024 Azerbaijan Airlines plane crash. MINVAL argues that Moscow's calls for partners to take Russian interests into account contrast with the handling of issues affecting Azerbaijan itself, including the involvement of Russian air-defense systems in the crash.

The article ultimately frames Zakharova's statement as evidence of Moscow's frustration with Azerbaijan's increasingly independent and diversified foreign policy. It emphasizes that Baku is expanding relations with Türkiye, Central Asia, Europe, China, the United States and Ukraine and does not regard its partnerships as mutually exclusive. The central message of the pro-government reaction is that Azerbaijan does not need Moscow's permission to develop relations with Kyiv and that Russia's attempts to influence such decisions increasingly reflect a struggle to preserve its traditional influence in the South Caucasus. Russia's Perm region has opened a criminal case against Ruslan Mamedov, an Azerbaijani citizen who was arrested on Aug.21, in connection with an offer for taking a bribe, local media report. A person of South Caucasus origin, being a leader of the Azerbaijani diaspora in Perm, had offered to illegally stop the criminal prosecution of a Perm resident through unidentified

law enforcement officers in exchange for a monetary reward, the FSB reported. Mamedov has been banned from entering Russia until June 4, 2076, in accordance with the law. (NEWS.AM / 21.08.2026)

Mother of Azerbaijani citizen detained in Russia claims son was tortured and pressured to speak against Azerbaijan

Trend reported on Aug.21 that the mother of Azerbaijani citizen Yadulla Ruffullayev, detained in Russia for alleged espionage, claims her son was tortured and subjected to psychological pressure by Russian investigators. She alleged that he was forced to sign documents he did not understand and pressured to make statements against Azerbaijan, which he reportedly refused. His family says he has been detained for more than a year, while the next court hearing is scheduled for August 31. The family has appealed to Azerbaijani authorities, including the Foreign Ministry and Embassy in Russia, for assistance. (TREND / 21.08.2026)

Baku conference calls for reparations for Belgian colonialism

The Baku Initiative Group (BIG), an Azerbaijani government-linked NGO, called on Belgium to provide reparations for abuses committed during its colonial rule, arguing that compensation should go beyond financial payments. At a conference in Baku on Aug.21 attended by representatives from former Belgian colonies including the DRC, Burundi and Rwanda, BIG highlighted the lasting consequences of Belgian colonialism. Note that Azerbaijan's campaign against Belgium is widely viewed as partly driven by tensions over Brussels' support for Armenia, particularly Belgium's criticism of Azerbaijan's treatment of Armenian prisoners. President Ilham Aliyev gave interview to Uzbekistan National News Agency

In an interview with Uzbekistan's National News Agency, President Aliyev said Azerbaijan-Uzbekistan relations have reached the level of an alliance, based on shared history, culture and mutual trust. He emphasized expanding cooperation in trade, investment, energy, transport, agriculture, education and culture. Bilateral trade exceeded \$795 million in 2025, more than tripling from the previous year. Aliyev also highlighted the countries' growing role in the Organization of Turkic States and Central Asian cooperation, particularly through the Middle Corridor, TRIPP and the emerging "C6" regional format. He said Azerbaijan's partnership with Uzbekistan and other Central Asian states would contribute to greater regional connectivity, stability and economic integration. (AZERTAG / 21.08.2026)

President Aliyev arrived in Uzbekistan on a state visit

President Aliyev, accompanied by First Lady Mehriban Aliyeva, arrived in Uzbekistan on Aug. 23 for a state visit. The visit centered on a one-on-one meeting between the two presidents, followed by the third meeting of the Supreme Interstate Council of Azerbaijan and Uzbekistan, held in Tashkent — a mechanism established in 2023, with earlier sessions in Tashkent (2024) and Baku (2025). The centerpiece agreement was the signing of the "Treaty on Eternal Friendship between the Republic of Azerbaijan and the Republic of Uzbekistan," under which the two countries agreed to base their relations on eternal friendship, mutual trust, strategic partnership and alliance, and to support each other's development paths. Multiple additional bilateral documents covering trade, investment, tourism, culture, social protection, education, justice and foreign-policy cooperation were signed and exchanged, and Mirziyoyev was awarded the "Heydar Aliyev" Order, while Aliyev received Uzbekistan's highest-degree Dostlik (Friendship) Order. Mirziyoyev was also invited to pay a state visit to Azerbaijan.

Statements from the leaders

Aliyev said that Azerbaijan and Central Asia constitute a single geopolitical and economic region with great potential. He thanked Mirziyoyev, highlighting his role in attracting investment to Karabakh and Uzbekistan's assistance in Karabakh's restoration. Mirziyoyev said cooperation between the countries "has already gone far beyond the bilateral agenda," pointing to Azerbaijan's accession to the Consultative Meetings of Central Asian Heads of State, and said the two countries "speak with one voice" internationally, coordinating within the UN, the Non-Aligned Movement, the Organization of Turkic States, the OIC and the CIS. He also announced Uzbekistan will hold Days of Azerbaijani Culture by year-end and said Tashkent is interested in creating a separate Uzbekistan-Azerbaijan corridor in the Caspian with a single operator.

Economic and infrastructure cooperation

The two leaders took part in inauguration and groundbreaking ceremonies for Azerbaijani-linked projects in Uzbekistan, including Davr Bank (International Bank of Azerbaijan), a gypsum plant (Matanat-A), two Landau STEAM schools, five new SOCAR filling stations, the Sea Breeze Uzbekistan complex, the Baku City residential complex, a silver-ore beneficiation plant, and fruit orchards. A new Tashkent development project was presented to Aliyev, and he attended the opening of a National Pedagogical University named after Nizami Ganjavi. Aliyev also said construction of a ferry for Uzbekistan should be accelerated.

On Aug. 23, First Lady Mehriban Aliyeva and First Lady of Uzbekistan Ziroatkhon Mirziyoyeva held a one-on-one meeting over tea in Tashkent. (AZERTAG / 23.08.2026)

Former Armenian defense minister claims Russia pressured Azerbaijan during 2020 war

Former Armenian Defense Minister Arshak Karapetyan has claimed that Russia provided military assistance to Armenia during the 2020 Karabakh war and pressured Azerbaijan to halt its advance (in Khankendi), allegedly deploying the Caspian Flotilla toward Baku and raising strategic aviation. The remarks were made in a video attributed to Karapetyan and were subsequently reported by several Russian- and Azerbaijani-language outlets. The specific military actions he described have not been independently verified. (MINVAL / 22.08.2026)

On the second, Aug.24, President Aliyev and First Lady Mehriban Aliyeva traveled from Tashkent to Bukhara. The two presidents and their wives toured several major historical sites, including the Ismail Samani Mausoleum, the Ark Fortress, the Poi-Kalon complex, the Labi-Hauz ensemble and Kukeldash Madrasah. The Bukhara program was largely cultural, highlighting the historical and civilizational links between Azerbaijan and Uzbekistan. The visit also had a family dimension, with the two presidential couples and family members participating in the sightseeing program. (AZERTAG / 24.08.2026)

President Aliyev congratulates Volodymyr Zelenskyy on Ukraine's 35th independence anniversary

President Aliyev sent a congratulatory letter to Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy and the Ukrainian people on the 35th anniversary of Ukraine's independence. He praised the countries' strategic partnership, highlighting political dialogue, high-level visits, energy cooperation and mutual support for each other's territorial integrity and sovereignty. Aliyev also expressed support for continued humanitarian assistance to Ukraine and deeper cooperation in trade, investment, agriculture and other sectors.

Note that during his visit to Tashkent, Ilham Aliyev announced that Azerbaijan plans to invest \$5 billion in Uzbekistan's tourism sector. Analysts, meanwhile, note a significant increase in the activity of Azerbaijani companies directly or indirectly linked to Aliyev's family in the Uzbek market, including PASHA Holding and the Sea Breeze project of the president's former son-in-law Emin Agalarov (REPORT, JAM-NEWS.NET / 24.08.2026)

Hikmat Hajiyev awarded Ukraine's Order of Merit, 3rd class

Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy awarded the assistant to the President of Azerbaijan - the head of the foreign policy department of the Presidential Administration, Hikmat Hajiev, with the Order of Merit of the 3rd class. (REPORT / 24.08.2026)

Azerbaijani Ambassador to Russia Rahman Mustafayev said Baku remains ready to develop allied relations with Moscow, but that negative coverage of Azerbaijan in Russian media is hindering bilateral cooperation. He said at least 96 Russian news portals, Telegram and YouTube channels regularly portray Azerbaijan as an “unfriendly” state and spread what Baku considers offensive and provocative statements. Mustafayev said Azerbaijan has raised the issue through diplomatic channels and expects Moscow to take concrete steps to address the situation and protect the countries’ strategic partnership. Presenting Armenia’s 2026–2031 government program in parliament on Monday, Prime Minister Nikol Pashinyan said maintaining, strengthening and institutionalizing peace with Azerbaijan would remain a key government priority. He said Armenia and Azerbaijan have recognized each other’s territorial integrity and sovereignty on the basis of the 1991 Alma-Ata Declaration, while the delimitation of their shared border would continue.

Pashinyan also said Armenia would seek to make the peace process irreversible by ending discussions on the return of Nagorno-Karabakh Armenians and refugees from Azerbaijan, while calling for an end in Azerbaijan to references to the return of “Western Azerbaijanis.” He argued that such claims should be removed from the political discourse of both countries to establish lasting peace.

He further stated that the release and return of Armenian citizens detained in Azerbaijan would remain on his government’s agenda until the issue is resolved. At the same time, Pashinyan identified implementation of the Trump Route for International Peace and Prosperity (TRIPP) as one of Armenia’s important upcoming tasks, describing it as a practical result of the Washington peace summit. Azerbaijan seeks to ease rising tensions between Israel and Turkey, Israeli media reports

Azerbaijan is reportedly working behind the scenes to ease growing tensions between Israel and Turkey, according to Israeli sources cited by Ynet. Baku is concerned that the deterioration could escalate into a direct confrontation between two of its close partners. Azerbaijan previously helped establish direct Israel–Turkey dialogue in April 2025, hosting delegations from both countries in Baku and facilitating a coordination mechanism on Syria. Israeli sources say Baku is now seeking to revive this mechanism and prevent further escalation. The report says Azerbaijan is well positioned to mediate because it maintains close relations with both Israel and Turkey. This role has become more important as Israel reportedly distrusts US envoy Tom Barrack's approach. (YNET / 23.08.2026)

US White Paper Names Azerbaijan in Chinese Tariff-Evasion Network

The Trump administration's White House white paper, The Great Transshipment Scam, has named Azerbaijan among more than 40 countries allegedly facilitating Chinese tariff evasion to maintain access to the U.S. market. Azerbaijan is classified as a "Tier III" country, with the report citing its rail and dry-port transit infrastructure, consolidation facilities and overland-to-maritime connections. The designation could complicate U.S.-Azerbaijan relations as Washington seeks to expand the Middle Corridor and advance the Armenia-Azerbaijan peace process. (EURASIANNET.ORG / 21.08.2026)

The Azerbaijani Foreign Ministry called the rally at the embassy in Moscow a provocation

On Aug. 27, a group of leftist and National Bolshevik activists staged a protest outside the Azerbaijani Embassy in Moscow, placing three posters accusing President Aliyev's government of anti-Russian policies and calling for an end to the alleged mistreatment of Russian citizens imprisoned in Azerbaijan. The activists also protested criminal cases and wanted notices issued by Azerbaijani authorities against Russian media figures and political analysts, including Ivan Knyazev, Semyon Uralov and Alexey Chadaev. The organizers accused Baku of pursuing an anti-Russian policy and criticized Moscow's response to the worsening bilateral relations.

Azerbaijani Foreign Ministry condemned the August 27 action as an "unacceptable provocation" and said it could be intended to artificially escalate tensions between the two countries. Baku called on Russian law enforcement agencies to investigate the incident and ensure the security of the Azerbaijani Embassy in accordance with the Vienna Convention. (KAVKAZ UZEL / 27.08.2026)

On Aug.27, FM Bayramov received Austria's newly appointed Ambassador Etienne Berchtold, with discussions focusing on expanding bilateral cooperation in politics, economy, energy, transport and other areas. The sides welcomed the start of Azerbaijani gas supplies to Austria and discussed Azerbaijan's role in European energy security, as well as Azerbaijan-Armenia normalization and regional stability. The sides discussed expanding bilateral cooperation in trade, economy, tourism and education, as well as Azerbaijan's role in transit and energy security. They also highlighted cooperation within the UN, OIC, Non-Aligned Movement and D-8, and discussed preparations for the CICA summit in Baku this year and Azerbaijan's planned hosting of the OIC Summit in 2027. On Aug. 27, Deputy Foreign Minister Yalchin Rafiyev attended the 23rd extraordinary OIC Council of Foreign Ministers meeting in Jeddah, where Ismail Ould Cheikh Ahmed of Mauritania was unanimously elected as the new OIC Secretary General. Rafiyev pledged Azerbaijan's support to the new secretary general and highlighted Azerbaijan's plans to host the OIC Summit and chair the organization in 2027. He also reaffirmed Baku's support for Palestine and stressed the importance of international law and humanitarian assistance. (TREND / 27.08.2026)

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
